SEATTLE—Volunteers are now being sought to fill open seats on the Community Advisory Board of public television stations KCTS 9 (Seattle) and KYVE 47 (Yakima). Advisory Board members serve three-year terms, providing input on programming and other activities, and helping the stations connect more effectively with their communities.

This is an exciting period for the Advisory Board, which seeks to diversify and strengthen its membership. Ideal candidates will have a strong interest in public television and the ability to work with others on behalf of their community.
